



Comprehensive Clinical Assessments (interRAI)

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Over the next four years our goal is to roll out this tool to all 700 plus aged care facilities across the country.

Our next steps are to identify suitable ARC facilities to become early adopters, and those ready to adopt over the next 10 months and be in Group One.

The process of identifying these facilities is:

1. Invitations sent out 1 September 2011
2. Organisations complete information form and return by 16 September 2011.
3. Responses reviewed against criteria and recommendations made to steering committee.
4. Steering Committee consider and approve list by 30 September 2011.
5. Respondents notified.

Early Adopter and Group One criteria

- 1. Identifying a Registered Nurse who will be a Lead Practitioner for that facility.**

Early Adopter and Group One criteria

- 2. Agree to releasing the RN for 3 days training plus competency assessments.**

Early Adopter and Group One criteria

**3. Agree to adopting interRAI for a 4 year period
as core electronic assessment instrument.**

Early Adopter and Group One criteria

**4. Agree to commit to a suitable date for training
and starting to use interRAI.**

Early Adopter and Group One criteria

**5. Agree not to run a dual system of assessment
i.e. not continuing with the past system
while using the new tool.**

Early Adopter and Group One criteria

6. A present ability to support this project with: A reliable broad band internet connection + an IT support system.

Early Adopter and Group One criteria

**7. Access to a Windows XP or Vista computer
with 2G RAM and IE 7 or 8 for the assessors**

What Providers Receive

- Licences to use system at no cost to the facility.
- Reliable hosting of the system for the 4 years of the project.
- Where required we will be making an additional computer / device available for assessors to use.
- Train the trainer model of training, which builds capacity in the sector to be self sustaining.
